## Remarks Ambassador Tanmaya Lal

## Friends,

- The scale and speed of transformation that is underway in India, world's largest democracy and fifth largest and fastest growing large economy offer unprecedented opportunities of collaboration with our partners.
- India's talent pool is also unmatched in its importance for global economy.
- India's **role and capabilities** in collectively addressing **global challenges** whether it is climate change or global health or peace & security are also expanding significantly.
- This is a special year for India Sweden partnership as we celebrate 75 years of our diplomatic relations.
- We welcome a close friend of India Ambassador Niclas Kvarnström, Head of Asia, Pacific and Latin America Division from Swedish Foreign Office who has taken time from his busy schedule to join us here this morning.
- This year is special for both our countries also in the context of their international responsibilities at a time of serious global challenges.
- India holds the Presidency of G20 and we compliment Sweden on a substantive EU presidency, which had several significant initiatives where India was also actively involved.
- One of the highlights of Sweden's EU Presidency was the EU-Indo Pacific Ministerial meeting in May in Stockholm where External Affairs Minister Dr. Jaishankar was a keynote speaker.
- Earlier in April, Sweden hosted the first ever India EU Political Directors'
  Deliberations in Malmö, a frank and rich discussion.
- Another very significant development has been the first ministerial meeting of the India-EU Trade and Technology Council during Swedish presidency. This brings India and EU closer as trusted technology partners.

- Sweden has also continued to support an early finalization of the India EU Trade and Investment Agreements.
- Over the last nine months or so, there have been nearly 10 ministerial engagements between our countries.
- Sweden's Ministers of Foreign Affairs, Foreign Trade, Infrastructure and Finance and State Secretary for Foreign Trade have visited India. Our External Affairs Minister had a very substantive visit to Sweden, the first such visit by an Indian Foreign Minister in nearly two decades.
- Our Ministers of Environment co-chaired Leadership Group on Industry Transition, an India Sweden global climate action initiative at COP27 in Sharmal-Sheikh.
- Ministerial delegations from the states of Uttar Pradesh and Tamil Nadu have had good visits to Sweden exploring investment and technology linkages. The 20th session of Joint Economic Commission was held in Delhi.
- High-profile business delegations have been exchanged.
- Sweden's Deputy Prime Minister alongwith our Minister for Science & Technology addressed the India Sweden Innovation Day. We had a substantive Engaging India seminar at Almedalen. Minister for Foreign Trade attended the Republic Day celebrations. Minister of Infrastructure attended the celebrations to mark 20 years of Sweden India Business Council.
- Last September Namaste Stockholm drew thousands of visitors despite rain where around 25 Indian groups performed in Kungsträgården. Indian groups also dazzled Gothenburg Kulturkalas marking 400 years of the city.
- Yoga enthusiasts celebrated International Yoga Day across Sweden.
- The India Sweden Sambandh has countless streams.
- During the last two years, I have spoken about some historical threads, for instance Swedish engineers who worked in India in iron works and railways in 1860s; the tradition of Indology studies in Uppsala going back 200 years; and a fascinating Sanskrit inscription on a rock there.
- The story of the much older **Helgö Buddha** is by now well-known.

- I have also spoken of the brave **Indian revolutionaries** Lala Hardayal and Virendranath Chattopadhyay who spent active years in Stockholm after the first World War. They had an office at Artillerigatan in Östermalm.
- Starting with Rabindranath **Tagore** in 1913, there have been several illustrious Indians who have been awarded the Noble Prize in various fields.
- A few months back, in Pune I attended the celebrations marking 100 years of SKF in India. Ericsson has been there even longer.
- This January the largest contingent at the 50<sup>th</sup> edition of the prestigious **Rilton Cup** in Sweden was from India and an Indian youngster won the cup. And **Pia Cramling**, the Swedish legend, won a Gold at the Chennai Chess Olympiad last November.
- Last week, I met **Thomas Dennerby** as he starts another innings as the Head Coach for the Indian Women Football Team, which is fast improving under his guidance.
- The world-renowned Coach Grandmaster **Ramesh Babu** has been partnering Swedish Chess authorities in coaching and mentoring young Swedish talent.
- It is great to see Indians doing well in Sweden.
- Here may I first condole the passing away of one of the most prominent members of Indian Diaspora Mr. Bicky Chakraborty, a highly successful entrepreneur and philanthropist, who was also a recipient of Pravasi Bharatiya Samman Award. He has left behind a substantial legacy.
- In the past one year alone we have seen several Indians making mark in Sweden.
- Last month I met Ms. Preeti Gahlawat who has been awarded the Lindqvist prize by Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences in the field of teaching science and technology.
- Prof Rishikesh Bhalerao from Swedish University of Agricultural Sciences in Umeå has been elected as Member of the European Molecular Biology Organisation last month.
- Prof Madhav Marathe from University of Virginia was awarded an Honorary Doctorate by Chalmer's University this February.
- Last October the Hasselblad award for Photography was awarded to Ms.
  Dayanita Singh from India.
- And a young scholar Mr. Kunal Deoskar whose Warli art design now adorns a student housing complex approach in Stockholm.

- And Ryan Thomas who has been elected as the Head of the Student Union at the Stockholm School of Economics.
- An interesting initiative has been the publication of a children's book- Farmors och Mormors Sagor - that introduces timeless Indian fables in Swedish language. Complements to Ms. Ujjwala Andersson Chaphalkar.
- Many congratulations to all of them and to any others who I may have missed.
- We are proud to see the contribution of Indian Diaspora to the Swedish economy, science, culture and society.
- You all are ambassadors for India. Your contributions and friendships are the bedrock of India Sweden Sambandh.
- Once again greetings on Independence Day and may we all continue to work for strengthening of India Sweden friendship.
