- **Greetings** to all of you on the 76th anniversary of India's Independence Day
- My thanks to the organisers of this special event. The PIO Chamber of Commerce & Industry.
- India is a nation rooted in one of the oldest civilizations and is defined by its democracy and great diversity among its people who represent one sixth of the entire humanity.
- There is a **fundamental unity** despite our megadiversity of languages, faiths, ethnicities, and arts & cultures.
- Indian civilization is the origin for many of the world's faiths and for sophistication in **philosophical thought**, **scientific and academic accomplishments** and highly **evolved cultural heritage**.
- From Yoga and Ayurveda to concept of Zero to advances in mathematics, calculus, astronomy, metallurgy, surgery, ship building to urban planning, water harvesting and remarkable architecture.
- Indian cultural imprint is visible in a number of countries in our region.
- India was among the leading economies not so long ago accounting for nearly a quarter of global economic output. The colonial phase disrupted societal and economic structures.
- Independence was won after a long hard, largely non-violent peoples' struggle. Freedom came at a huge cost. A traumatic partition and massive forced migration. As an independent nation, India started from a very difficult situation.
- We have come a long way since our independence.
- And now as we have entered Amrit Kaal, the pace of change is exponential.

- Despite global headwinds, India has emerged as the **fifth largest economy** and the **fastest growing** large economy of the world. It is estimated that as much as 14% of global growth in the next five years will come from India. India is on way to becoming third largest global economy in absolute terms.
- The scale and speed of transformation that is underway in India in **Digital** sphere, in **Green** transition, **manufacturing** and **infrastructure** offer unprecedented opportunities of collaboration with our partners.
- India's talent pool is also unmatched in its importance for global economy.
- India's role and capabilities in collectively addressing global challenges whether it is climate change or global health or peace & security are also growing significantly.
- India has now the **third largest startup ecosystem** in the world and the global leader in **digital payments**.
- More than 11,000 km of highways are being built or expanded every year.
 4,500 km of new railway tracks have been built in the last one year alone.
 6,000 route km of railways have been electrified in the last two years.
- Number of airports has doubled to around 150 in the last few years. Several airports now run on solar power. By 2030 around 13 million electric vehicles will be sold annually in India.
- **Startups** are making advanced drones, working on Al & robotics and even launching rockets and satellites.
- And our third mission to the moon **Chandrayaan-3** is now orbiting the moon. An Indian **human space mission** is on the cards soon.
- India and Latvia are good friends. The peoples of our countries share civilizational bonds, as expressed in similarities in Latvian and Sanskrit languages.
- Our partnership is growing steadily.
- Over the last year, there have been several high-level engagements between India and Latvia.
- **H.E. Edgars Rinkēvičs**, then Foreign Minister met our External Affairs Minister Dr. Jaishankar in Stockholm on the sidelines of the EU-Indo Pacific Ministerial meeting shortly before he took office as the President.
- State Secretary Andris Pelšs and then Parliamentary State Secretary Ms.
 Gunda Reire, now the Head of Office of the President, have visited India in recent months.

- I have also had discussions with colleagues in Latvian Foreign Office on exploring new areas of collaboration.
- Some of you would be aware of the wonderful exhibition of Indian art collection at the Art Museum Riga Bourse in January this year. It is the largest India collection in the Baltics.
- It was also good to have eminent scholar **Dr. Sigma Ankrava** releasing her Latvian translation of the ancient Indian epic Ramayana on that occasion.
- We had excellent interaction with some of the Latvian experts from different fields who have attended **ITEC** programmes in India over the last several years.
- The **International Day of Yoga** was organised in Riga in June this year at the University of Latvia.
- The Ayurveda Chair at the University of Latvia is another important initiative by both our governments.
- These are difficult and uncertain times.
- At this challenging time, India is leading the **G20** deliberations this year. India is helping push issues of wider concern, especially among developing countries such as debt crisis, food, fuel, fertilizer security on the global agenda.
- Our engagement with Latvia has a strong EU context also. An India EU Trade and Technology Council has been launched. Negotiations our underway to finalize India-EU Trade and Investment Agreements.
- Latvia is the Coordinating Country for the NB8 grouping this year that brings together Nordic and Baltic countries. India is becoming actively engaged with NB8 both on political and business agendas.
- In addition to Yoga, one of the important global initiatives taken by India has been the focus on millets as climate-smart super food in time of food insecurity. The United Nations is marking this year as the **International Year of Millets**.
- Last October, Prime Minister Modi and UN Secretary Geneal Antonio Guterres jointly launched **Mission Life**, which focusses on encouraging all of us to adopt lifestyles which are environmentally sustainable.
- These efforts are in addition to initiatives such as International Solar Alliance and the Coalition for Disaster Resilient Infrastructure.

- The **Indian Diaspora abroad are Ambassadors** for India. This includes all of you whether you are businesspersons, professionals or students or researchers.
- You represent India's diversity, strength and dynamism.
- We greatly value your contribution not only to the society and economy of your host country but also in building bridges of friendship at people-to-people level.
- May I conclude by greeting you again on this 76th anniversary of India's independence.
