Many of the **Indian deities** are associated with music and dance.

For instance, **Lord Shiva** is also conceived as the **Nataraja** or the divine dancer. Nataraja bronze statues from Chola period are well known. In those he is visualised as dancing while holding a **Damaru**, which is a small percussion instrument, whose sound symbolises the **primordial sound** that created the universe.

Lord Krishna is also associated with mesmerising music especially flute playing.

Taala or musical meters are referenced in ancient **Vedic texts**. Performing arts are described in great details in the ancient text of **Natya Shastra** which is around two thousand years old.

Music and dance have been **handed down over generations** through a strong **oral** and **Guru-Shishya** or Teacher-student traditions.

Music has always been part of the Human story.

Despite such a wide range of traditions around the world, **music transcends cultures**, **languages** and borders.
